

Village Class: 45 minutes class with caregiver
(birth-18 months old)

Cock-A-Doodle-Moo: It's time to head for the farm! In this class, you will sing songs about the farm, including "Old MacDonald," "Hayride," and "Clever Cows." The children even get to go on a "hayride" in class. You will enjoy playful activities with your child, including infant massage, exercise, fun circle dances, and quiet time.

Home Materials: Board book, home CD, Sunshine Jingle instrument, art banners.
(1st half of the semester)

DewDrops: Stop and smell the roses—and lily of the valley, and tulips, and pansies. In this class, parents and babies will play and move together to songs about flowers, such as "Jasmine Flower," "How Does Your Garden Grow," and "White Coral Bells." You'll also hear traditional Irish music, dance a jig and move to the "Irish Trot."

Home Materials: Board book, home CD, flower bells instrument, art banners.
(2nd half of the semester)

Our Time Class: 45 minutes with a caregiver
(18 months-3 years old)

Away We Go! Hop on the train, get in the car, board the plane, and *Away We Go!* This class focuses on transportation, a favorite topic for toddlers who are on the go, go, go! Sing and play along with favorite songs, such as "I've Been Workin' on the Railroad" and "Wheels on the Bus". Explore fast and slow, smooth and bumpy, and high and low. Come along with Shiny Dinah the train as she helps us explore many different fun ways to travel.

Home Materials: Double home CDs, 2 interactive story books, home activity book, two harmonicas designed for toddlers.

Imagine That Class: 60 minutes with a caregiver joining class
for the last 15 minutes (3-5 years old)

Toys I Make, Trips I Take: Come along as we enjoy pretend play in a toy shop full of wonderful toys. We'll use the theme of our toy shop to enjoy fun activities such as building unique creations, and dancing as if we were the toys in the shop. We will use rhythm and songs with every imaginary saw, hammer, and nail. Your preschooler will further develop his/her sense of sequencing events, which is good for storytelling, as well as make their ideas a reality.

Home Materials: Two books, Double Home CD, Family Activity Book, drum.

Young Child II and IV: 60 minutes with a caregiver joining
class for the last 15 minutes (5-7 years old)

What A Parent and Child Will Experience In This Class Through

Music: Singing and vocal development, movement, reading and writing, focused listening, exploring and playing musical instruments. Children begin developing a level of musical understanding in the Young Child classes that they will retain through adulthood and that will benefit them greatly in any musical endeavor they may experience.
